PARENTS' RIGHT-TO-KNOW

Seminole County Public Schools takes pride in ensuring a superior learning experience and is dedicated to providing the highest quality education for all students. As part of this commitment, parents of students attending a Title I school will be provided information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher and paraprofessionals as requested. Additionally, schools will inform parents if their child is assigned to a teacher for four or more consecutive weeks who is not state certified or licensed for the grade level and/or subject areas in which the teacher is providing instruction. If you have any questions about the professional qualifications or your child's teacher, please reach out to your Title I school.

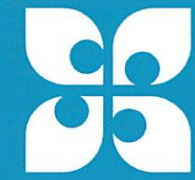

BUILDING FAMILY CAPACITY TO SUPPORT STUDENT LEARNING



Parent & Family Engagement staff implement workshops in an effort to build the capacity for strong family engagement. These workshops support effective partnerships between schools, families, and our community.

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Evening Events:

Evening workshops support and encourage family involvement in student education and are facilitated by SCPS staff. They provide families with the opportunity to practice new learning strategies and receive materials that will support academic achievement at home.

Family Empowerment Series:

Scheduled for the 2nd Tuesday of each month, this series is developed around topics identified by families. The workshops promote positive family engagement by addressing both academic and non-academic barriers that could impact the way in which parents actively engage in their students' education.

Out of the Box Wednesdays:

Conducted after school every Wednesday, these activities align with Florida State Standards and are adaptable for grades K-8.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

Computer Lab:

The computer lab offers families access to free Internet and printing services. Families can also use this space to complete tasks such as assist their student with online homework, access Skyward, and complete other tasks in accordance to computer lab guidelines. Resource Library:

Learning materials are available to check out through the Family Resource Center. There are over 1,200 academic games, books and activities available for use by students in grades K-8 who attend Title I schools. These reading, math and science resources support student academic achievement at home through family engagement. Families may check out up to two resources per student, for up to two weeks at a time.

SCHOOL-HOME PARTNERSHIPS

The Family Action Collaborative Team of Seminole (FACTS) is a representation of Title I family members, SCPS school and district-level staff, and community members who collaborate to develop, refine, and evaluate the district-level Title I Parent & Family Engagement Plan. Annual Needs Assessment and Evaluation
